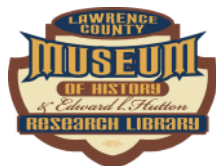

Many items can be brought for appraisal including small items of furniture or pictures of larger pieces. Coins, jewelry, or stamps can not be appraised. Items to be appraised can be discussed with the director during ticket purchase. It is not required to bring an item for appraisal.
